### **V. Canada and the Repeal of the Corn Laws**

Corn Laws in 1846, and later revived in some measure by the com-pensating repeal of the Navigation Laws in 1849, was the view normally held by Canadian writers in 1850 Having its origin in past politics, it characteristically exalts the influence of legislation It is hoped to show
